The schwa vowel (squashed vowel): sound /u/ about the ribbon upon cushion and the sound of the article 'a' as in a cat

Spellings in the handbook are shown either within inverted commas, e.g. 'e' 'ee' 'ea', or they are underlined, e.g. <u>e</u> <u>ea</u> or they are in bold within a word, e.g. me tree team

\*The spelling 'th' has two sounds: thin (unvoiced), that (voiced).

Spellings are included in one syllable words as well as multi-syllable words.
